Production Notes

Written by Neil Simon, *The Good Doctor* is a series of short plays based on the work of Russian writer Anton Chekhov. While the two authors have very different comedic styles – Simon is known for his wit while Chekhov is famous for his satire – *The Good Doctor* successfully blends the talents of each, to hilarious effect.

OVERVIEW

Simon's work frames the short plays by introducing a "Writer" character who appears at points throughout. This character, who suffers from writer's block, is a thinly veiled version of Chekhov himself.

The original Broadway production of *The Good Doctor* opened in 1973 and enjoyed a lengthy run. It was nominated for five Tony Awards, ultimately winning the award for Featured Actress in a Play.

1899 Uncle Vanya produced successfully by Moscow Art Theatre

1901 Three Sisters produced by Moscow Arts Theatre, but poorly received; marries actress Olga Knipper

1904 The Cherry Orchard produced in January; dies in July following two heart attacks 1950s Works as a TV writer

1961 First solo play Come Blow Your Horn enjoys success on Broadway

1963 Barefoot in the Park establishes his success as a playwright

1965 The Odd Couple opens on Broadway

1968 The Odd Couple film receives an Oscar nomination

1973 The Good Doctor runs for 208 performances on Broadway

1983 Brighton Beach Memoirs

1983 Broadway's Alvin Theatre renamed the Neil Simon Theatre

1991 Lost in Yonkers wins the Pulitzer Prize for drama
